



Border Ranges National Park's highlight is the amazing view from **The Pinnacle Lookout**.

The Pinnacle Walk is like no other in the region (0.2km 10 minutes return) & offers dramatic views of the Mt Warning Caldera. The track finishes at a lookout platform with spectacular views of Mt Warning & the Tweed Valley 1000m below.

Border Ranges National Park to Kyogle— Driving Directions

- ⇒ Exit the park at Wiangaree on the Western side of the park & travel along the Summerland Way southwards towards Kyogle— a scenic 13km drive from the park exit.
- ◆ *Camping is available at two great spots on the Western side of the Park at Forest Tops + Sheepstation Creek .*
- ◆ *Pick up a map + brochure of the park at Nimbin Visitor Information Centre.*

Nimbin to Blue Knob—

Driving Directions

- ⇒ Head North on Cullen St towards Thorburn St.
- ◆ *You will pass the Candle Factory on your right—make sure you drop in and check out the colourful candles made using all renewable energy.*
- ⇒ Continue on Cullen St for about 1km and it will become Blue Knob Rd. Follow Blue Knob Rd for approx 6km.
- ◆ *Keep an eye out on the left for the Blue Knob Hall Gallery & Café - perfect place to stop for a peek at local artists work (Thu-Sun)*

Nimbin Experiences

Nimbin was once a sleepy little dairying village. Today Nimbin is known and famous for being a hippy destination and alternative lifestyle capital. Nimbin shot to fame when it hosted the 1973 Aquarius Festival, attracting students, hippies and visionaries from all over Australia. Many of them stayed on to live the dreams and ideology of Aquarius and to sow the seeds for today's vibrant community.

Nimbin is intriguing and quirky with its unique mural streetscape of indigenous, rainforest and psychedelic facades and colourful local characters. Cullen Street has an amazing array of cafes, craft shops, galleries and retail outlets.



Nimbin Candle Factory

For over 30 years, this family-run business has been making beautiful traditional, non-toxic candles using essential oils and vegetable dyes. Their water powered dipping deck was inspired by similar equipment used in ancient monasteries. Open daily, located at The Old Butter Factory on Mulgum Creek.

Djanbung Gardens Permaculture Centre

Djanbung Gardens is a living 'learnscape' of working permaculture systems and sustainability in action. What was once a 5 acre cow pasture has been transformed into amazing organic gardens of herbs, exotic spices, orchards, tropical fruit, bush foods, aquaculture, creative water systems, innovative natural building technologies, wildlife and bush regeneration. Open Tues-Sat 10.30am to 3pm for self guided tours.

Blue Knob Hall Gallery & Café is nestled below the sacred landmark of Lillian Rock, this quaint co-operative gallery offers a changing exhibition program & a beautiful outlook over Blue Knob Mountain & Nightcap National Park. The Cafe is available, by pre-bookings only, for 10 or more people during Gallery opening hours: Thu-Sun 10am -4pm

Blue Knob Farmers Market is on at the Gallery every Saturday 8:30am-3pm.

Driving Directions

- ⇒ Continue North East on Blue Knob Rd towards Kyogle/Murwillumbah Rd.
- ⇒ Turn left towards Kyogle & continue on the Kyogle/Murwillumbah Rd.
- ⇒ Turn right into Williams Rd & then turn into Creegan Rd which becomes Tweed Range Scenic Drive and takes you into The Border Ranges National Park.
- ◆ *Tweed Range Scenic Drive is a gravel road which traverses the eastern plateau of this World Heritage Rainforest area.*
